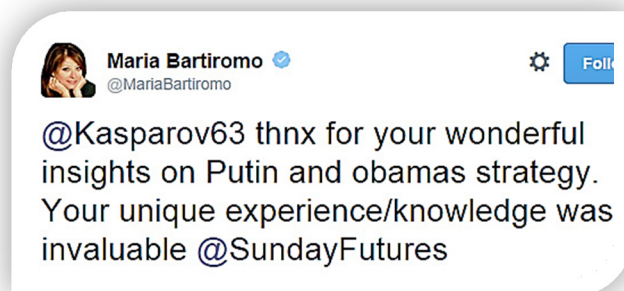
**Garry Kasparov has been one of the most consistent and engaging voices on Russia and foreign policy for over 20 years.** He first contributed an op-ed to the Wall Street Journal in 1991 and has since published hundreds of articles and made countless television appearances to share his analysis and insight on Russia, Western policy, and his personal experiences as a Soviet citizen and pro-democracy leader in Russia.



**Time and again Kasparov's prognostications and opinions have been proven correct on everything from the brief duration of the 1991 coup against Gorbachev to Putin's ambitions against Ukraine.** His outlook is sought by investor groups, universities, and think tanks around the world. For old media and new, from the Sunday shows to his popular Twitter (120K) and Facebook (150K), Garry Kasparov has become the go-to source for unflinching candor and remarkable accuracy on Russia.

**His status as a legendary world chess champion only enhance Kasparov's appeal as a contributor and guest, and chess and human rights are hardly his only claims to fame.** His profound

writing and dynamic lectures on strategy and decision-making have become touchstones in the business and technology communities, cited by everyone from MIT artificial intelligence professors to Credit Suisse analyst reports, and luminaries like Maria Bartiromo and Peter Thiel. In the past several years alone has delivered speeches and seminars for IBM, Google, Facebook, Oxford Martin, The Cato Institute, General Electric, and the World Business Forum.





Garry Kasparov's irresistible combination of personal history, expertise, and outspoken charisma have led to frequent high-profile appearances. He has been the subject of a long profile by David Remnick in *The New Yorker*, a guest on *The Colbert Report*, consulted and cited by US Presidents and members of Congress, named to the TIME 100, and received a standing ovation as the keynote speaker at the 2014 Cato Institute Milton Friedman Prize dinner.



Kasparov's unmatched credibility comes from many years of being proven correct by events and from his own experiences. Twice arrested by the dictatorial regime of Vladimir Putin, once badly beaten by police in full view of the international media, Kasparov has protested in the streets of Moscow and spoken in parliaments around the world for the cause of individual freedom. He is the chairman of the NY-based Human Rights Foundation, which organizes the annual Oslo Freedom Forum, called "The Davos of Dissidents."
